Student Resource Scheme (SRS) Invoices

School Council: call for nominations

Role of the School Council

All Independent Public Schools (including ours) are required to have a School Council to advise on matters of school culture and business.

You can find more information about the structure and role of our council on our website.

Thank you to recent representatives

We would like to say thanks once again to our retiring School Council members Jess Jennings (parent representative) and Brooke Arseneau (non-teaching staff representative) for their two years' service. Their valuable contribution has been very much appreciated.

As these roles have fallen vacant, it's now time for us to appoint replacement representatives: Are you up for taking part?

Parent representative nominations

The role of the parent representative is to share perspectives of school parents on matters before the School Council.

They will obviously bring their own perspective, and will seek to also be aware of and communicate the views of other parents in the community.

There are two parent representative roles on the School Council, appointed for two years on alternate years. The longest serving parent representative becomes the School Council Chair for the second year of their service.

Parent Reference Group

This year, to help our parent representatives stay connected to what's top of mind for parents across the school, we would also like to trial the formation of an informal *Parent Reference Group* for the School Council, made up of one or two parents from each year group.

This group would meet for about an hour twice per term (once ahead of School Council meetings to provide parent voice on topics for discussion, then again afterwards to understand outcomes and communicate these to the wider parent community).

As this is an informal group, these positions will not be elected. If there are more than 12 parents interested we will rotate parents through the reference group over the year (for example, each term).

How to nominate for the parent representative role

The returning officer for parent representative nominations is School Council Chair Ben Connell.

To nominate, please email an expression of interest (accompanied by a bio and photo), to schoolcouncil@cannonhilss.eq.edu.au before close of business on **Monday 24 April**.

The election of the parent representative will take place at the next **P&C Meeting** on **Monday 8 May** (in the studio, located in the upper school classroom area, at 6.30pm), and all candidates must attend.

Anyone present in person at that meeting can vote (there is a prescribed, paper ballot). Votes will be counted on the night and the elected candidate will be announced at the meeting.

Candidates can call for a scrutineer (but must give the returning offer the scrutineer's name by close of business on **Wednesday 3 May**).

If you have an interest in matters of school business, this is a great opportunity to make a positive contribution to your community.

The School Council meets for around two hours each term, so the parent representative role commitment would involve attending those meetings, as well as the *Parent Reference Group* meetings referred to above.

Non-teaching staff representative nominations

Election of the non-teaching staff representative will take place at a staff meeting, and our team members will be advised of the nomination process shortly.



Teaching and learning at our school Co-curricular activities

Here are shortcuts to more information about some of our current co-curricular and learning extension opportunities:

- Morning sport: Our before-school sport program is curated by our PE teacher on a term-by-term basis according to resourcing and interest. If you have coaching skills in a particular sport and would be interested in helping out with Morning sport, please <a href="mailto:ema
- Lunchtime clubs: We run a series of free, supervised, engaging activities during first break play time every day. These too are curated term-by-term popular recurring clubs have included Coding Club, Environment Club, Art Club, Dance Club, and Kitchen Garden club. Our staff usually facilitate each activity, although sometimes our Year 6 student leaders also develop and support additional clubs.
- Nature play: We are an accredited nature play school, and our students participate in activities that involve engaging with the natural environment during break time as well as during learning play. Nature play can take many forms, including caring for the school chickens, banks play, cubby

- building, mud kitchens and physical challenges like tree climbing.
- <u>Chess Club</u>: every Friday after school, run by <u>Gardiner</u>
 Chess.
- Instrumental music and Music extension: these are learning extension programs for older students – with a limited number of places available, we usually invite interested students towards the end of Year 3.

 - <u>Private piano lessons</u> are available on school grounds (during class time) through an independent provider.
- Competitions and challenges: We have been partnering with families to facilitate participation by interested students in a range of learning extension activities.
 The <u>Premier's Reading Challenge</u>, <u>Premier's Coding Challenge</u>, <u>Queensland Science Contest and ICAS Assessments</u> are examples of some of the additional activities our students participated in during 2022.
 These activities have generally formed part of the suite of learning extension options we offer to students who have been formally identified as being conventionally gifted and talented.

Our learning inclusion team tests all students at the end of Year 2 (using CogAT) to identify candidates for extension programs, but of course we welcome extension participation by any student who is up for a challenge.

If you would like to learn more about co-curricular learning opportunities to suit your child, please ask your child's teacher.

Similarly, if you become aware of another learning extension opportunity suitable for your child (or potentially, for other students as well) you're welcome to bring it to our attention.

Once confirmed, details of various 2023 activities will appear in the <u>calendar</u> at the end of each bulletin.

Extension activity: Italian Calligram Competition

Here's a (slightly **updated**) message from our Italian teacher Signora Natalia about this year's Calligram competition, an extension activity our students are beginning in class (and may choose complete at home):

Buongiorno a tutti! Students from Years 2-6 may come home with their calligram (drawing made only with Italian words) as part of their preparation for the Queensland-wide Calligram Competition run by the Italian Language Centre.

Calligrams are pictures made from words only - rules are strict and there are to be no lines or colouring in. Each year level has their own little additional language rules over and above the theme of 'Set the table! let's eat!'. We have been reviewing these in class during Week 8.

Entries are due back by Thursday 25 May (Term 2, Week 6). Students just need to complete their entry and write their full name and class lightly in pencil on the back. They can deliver the entry to the office, place it in Signora's pigeonhole, or give it to Signora in class. Signora will then choose the finalists (six from Year 5/6, six from Year 4/5, six from Year 3 and six from Year 2). These will then be sent away for final judgement. Happy creating!

Learning support and inclusion

More about inclusion at CHSS

In our <u>Week 9 bulletin</u> (PDF, 2.8MB) bulletin, we included a bit of background about our approach to supporting student learning through inclusion, and the contact details for the team members responsible.

This week, we thought we'd provide a bit more context, as there's a lot going on in the inclusion space at the moment.

Equity and excellence

This year, the department launched our new blueprint for a progressive, high-performing education system, <u>Equity and excellence</u>: <u>realising the potential of every student</u>.

We encourage interested families to explore the resources available on that website, which provide valuable insights into the evidence, consultation and thinking behind this initiative.

If you review that content, you'll see that everything we're doing locally is part of a much bigger vision, as we as a nation have "committed to equity and excellence in education – that all children and young people are confident, creative lifelong learners active in their community...".

This is a statement which aligns very neatly with the values our local school community has held dear for a very long time, and we are excited to be contributing to a much broader, organised movement in support of the outcomes we want for our students.

There are a lot of productive developments in train, including reasonable adjustment resourcing for students with disability (which reduces the requirement on parents and carers to obtain additional medical or specialist reports).

Our school leadership and our inclusion team have been putting a huge effort into understanding and implementing the new blueprint at our school, and we look forward to sharing more of this journey with you next term.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

These past two weeks, our staff and students have been reflecting on our PBL work this term, and workshopping areas of opportunity for refinement and improvement. Many students have demonstrated very mature understanding of the aims of the PBL program, and have contributed valuable insights to inform our approach moving forward.

We will soon be sending a Konnective inviting our broader community to provide feedback, which will be gathered via an online survey.

Please keep an eye out for that message, and when it lands, let us know what you think is working (and any suggestions you might have for improvements).

We are grateful to have such an engaged community (rich with capable critical thinkers), so we're really looking forward to hearing your ideas.

Hearing and vision testing

As part of our inclusion work, we arrange hearing and vision screening for students.

Usually, the focus of this work is the Prep cohort, but we also are mindful of the needs of students in other year levels (particularly those who have joined us after completing Prep elsewhere).

Recently, we sent correspondence to the families of students in **Prep**, **Year 6** and certain new students regarding the hearing screening session that will take place on **Wednesday 3 May**.

If you received that correspondence, please take a moment to consider it, and if you wish your child to be tested, register with the service provider via the QR code provided by **Sunday 23 April**.




Piano lessons
