Application to enrol in a Queensland state school

This sheet contains information on how to complete the Application for student enrolment form (SEF-1 Version 8).

Entitlement to enrolment

Under the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 (Qld) a state school must enrol a prospective student if they are entitled to enrolment. While not exhaustive, the following matters may affect a prospective student's entitlement to enrol in a state school:

- if the school has a School Enrolment Management Plan or an Enrolment Eligibility Plan (enrolment is subject to eligibility under the plan)
- the applicant is a prospective mature age student (the applicant can only apply for enrolment at a mature age state school and will be subject to a satisfactory criminal history check, or as a student in a program of distance education. All prospective mature age students must have a remaining allocation of state education.)
- the prospective student is not of correct age for enrolment (relates to Preparatory Year and Years 1 to 6)
- the prospective student has been excluded, or is subject to suspension from a state school at the time of the application
- the school principal reasonably believes that the prospective student presents an unacceptable risk to the safety or wellbeing of members of the school community (application is referred to the Director-General)
- the school is a state special school and the prospective student does not meet the criteria for enrolment in a special school
- the proposed enrolment requires approval as part of a flexible arrangement under s. 183 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006 (Qld), and the arrangement has not yet been approved
- the prospective student is not an Australian resident or citizen or the child of an Australian permanent resident or citizen (visa restrictions may apply, fees may be charged, in some cases legislation requires that the prospective student must obtain approval from the Chief Executive via Education Queensland International (EQI) to enrol)
- the school does not offer the year level that the prospective student should be enrolled in
- the prospective student has no remaining semester allocation of state education.
 Enrolment cannot proceed until additional semesters are applied for by the prospective student (or parent on their behalf) and granted.

Prospective student

A prospective student is a person who has applied to enrol at a state school but who has not yet been accepted for enrolment.

Parent's occupation and education
All parents across Australia, no matter which
school their child attends, are asked to
provide information about family background
(answering this question is optional). The
main purpose of collecting this information is
to promote an education system which is fair
for all Australian students regardless of their
background.

Court Orders

Any court orders concerning the prospective student's welfare, safety or parenting arrangements should be provided to the school, and the school should also be provided with any new or updated orders.

Name on enrolment form

A prospective student should be enrolled under their legal name as per their birth certificate. There is provision to also record a preferred family and/or given name. The preferred name will be used on internal school documents such as class rolls. The legal name will appear on semester reports unless there is a specific request to use the preferred name only. This request can come from parents/carers or the student (if the student is independent/mature age).

Gender

Information about gender is supplied to the Federal Government to comply with State funding agreements. The gender category with which a person identifies may not match the sex they were assigned at birth. There is no requirement for a student's gender recorded on this form to align with the sex shown on their birth certificate or passport.

Religious Instruction

Religious instruction is a program approved and provided by a religious denomination or religious society. Other instruction relates to part of a subject area that has been covered within the curriculum and may include, but is not limited to, personal research and/or assignments, revision of class work, and wider reading. Information about religious instruction available at the school, and about other instruction, is provided by the school at the time of enrolment and on the school's website.

Enrolment Agreement – Cannon Hill State School

This enrolment agreement sets out the responsibilities of the student, parents or carers and the school staff about the education of students enrolled at Cannon Hill State School.

Responsibility of student to:

- attend school regularly, on time, ready to learn and take part in school activities
- act at all times with respect and show tolerance towards other students and staff
- work hard and comply with requests or directions from the teacher and principal
- abide by school rules, meet homework requirements and wear school's uniform
- respect the school environment.

Responsibility of parents to:

- attend open evenings for parents
- let the school know if there are any problems that may affect my child's ability to learn
- inform school of reason for any absence
- treat school staff with respect and tolerance
- support the authority and discipline of the school enabling my child to achieve maturity, self discipline and self control
- abide by school's policy regarding access to school grounds before, during and after school hours.

Responsibility of school to:

- develop each individual student's talent as fully as possible
- inform parents and carers regularly about how their children are progressing
- inform students, parents and carers about what the teachers aim to teach the students each term
- teach effectively and to set the highest standards in work and behaviour
- take reasonable steps to ensure the safety, happiness and self-confidence of all students

CANNON HILL STATE SCHOOL INTERNET AND EMAIL AGREEMENT

Internet access and Electronic Mail (E-Mail) are available to students at Cannon Hill State School. We believe the Internet offers vast, diverse, and unique resources to both students and teachers. Our goal in providing this service is to promote educational excellence in our school by facilitating resource sharing, innovation, and communication. To gain access to the Internet, all students must obtain parental permission and must sign and return this form.

Access to the Internet will enable students to explore thousands of libraries, databases, and bulletin boards while exchanging messages with Internet users throughout the world. Families should be warned that some material accessible via the Internet may contain items that are illegal, defamatory, inaccurate, or potentially offensive to some people.

While our intent is to make Internet access available to further educational goals and objectives, students may find ways to access other materials as well. Education Queensland has filters in place that block unsuitable sites from student use. The most viewed websites are monitored and assessed in their relation to class content and goals, and may be blocked if deemed irrelevant or unacceptable. We believe that the benefits to students from access to the Internet, in the form of information resources and opportunities for collaboration, exceed any disadvantages. However, Cannon Hill State School supports and respects each family's right to decide whether of not to authorize internet and email access.

School Internet and E-Mail Rules

Students are responsible for good behaviour on school computer networks just as they are in a classroom or in the school grounds. Communications on the network are often public in nature. General school rules for behaviour and communications apply.

The network is provided for students to conduct research and communicate with others. Access to network service is given to students who agree to act in a considerate and responsible manner. Parent permission is required. Access is a privilege - not a right. Access entails responsibility.

Individual users of computers are responsible for their behaviour and communications over those networks. It is presumed that users will comply with school standards and will honor the agreements they have signed. The school will endeavour to reinforce the standards set out in the agreement.

Computer storage areas may be treated like school lockers. Teachers and staff may review files and communications to maintain system integrity and ensure that users are using the system responsibly. Users should not expect that files stored on the school server will be private.

During school, teachers will guide students toward appropriate materials. Outside of school, families bear the same responsibility for such guidance as they exercise with information sources such as television, telephones, movies, radio, and other potentially offensive media.



Individual users of the Internet are expected to abide by the generally-accepted rules of network etiquette. The following are not permitted:

- Sending or displaying offensive messages or pictures
- Using obscene language
- Harassing, insulting or attacking others
- Damaging computers, computer systems, software, or computer networks
- Violating copyright laws
- Using another's id/password
- Illegal use of data in folders or work files
- Intentionally wasting limited resources
- Employing the network for commercial purposes

In the event a student engages in any of the above-referenced activities, his/her access privileges will be revoked and other disciplinary measures may result.

Consequences for Unacceptable Use of the Internet at Cannon Hill State School:

If a student violates any part of this policy, the consequences will be:

First Offense: Students will lose their Internet access for one week.

Second Offense: Students will lose their Internet access for one month and the teacher will phone the parent or quardian.

Third Offense: Internet access will be suspended for the remainder of the term, the teacher will call the parent or guardian, and the student may be placed on a level.
